Preparation of Cucurbituril-Loaded PVC Nanofiber Membrane for Metal Ion Recovery

Effective tethering of cucurbituril (CBn) on azidized electrospun polyvinyl chloride (PVC) nanofiber (NF) was performed. The tethering strategy takes advantage of the spontaneous generation of nitrenes from azido groups as a consequence of either UV irradiation or thermolysis. Although immobilized CBn would assume different orientations due to the tendency of nitrenes to insert liberally and non-selectively into C-H bonds, their metal cation receptor capability nevertheless remains remarkably potent since the carbonyl rims are essentially unaltered. As such, the tendency for a 2:1 metal to CBn complexation ratio was observed. Batch adsorption experiments show that the CBn-loaded PVC NF may be used to capture metal ions from aqueous media.
