

Ultrathin electrodes-based single-cell technology for monitoring dopamine exocytosis

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Ultrathin Au nanowire (NW) electrodes-based single-cell system was developed for monitoring dopamine exocytosis. This system enables both an electrical cell stimulation and detection of the resulting neurotransmitter release with extremely high spatial resolution [1]. With highly precise and well-controlled electrode-to-cell interface, we observed that dopamine release from a PC12 cell is more stimulated by a more negative voltage pulse, which opens Ca²⁺ channels of the cell membrane for dopamine exocytosis. Detailed single-cell level studies of the biological responses to electrical stimulation could help us to understand such mechanisms and improve therapeutic efficacy.
